• On-going and Upcoming Health Projects.

Two new aquatic animal health projects have been approved for FAO funding under FAO's Technical Cooperation Program and one project under ASEAN-US Cooperation

- "Health Management in Freshwater Aquaculture (November 2002 to April 2004)" for Indonesia, a follow-up support project from the suspected KHV outbreak. The objectives of the project, which are in line with the recommendations of the Task Force, are: (a) strengthen diagnostic and control capabilities within the responsible state agencies for major diseases of cultured freshwater fish, including koi and common carp; (b) improve capacity for vulnerable rural aqua-farmers to face future outbreaks in their culture systems; (c) enhance national regulatory frameworks and legislature, improve biosecurity measures, and strengthen national disease surveillance and reporting, to reduce the risk of movement of pathogens, both nationally and internationally, through movement of live aquatic animals; and (d) develop and implement Indonesia's National Strategy on Aquatic Animal Health Management.
- "Shrimp Disease Control and Coastal Management" for India, another follow-up support to NACA/MPEDA's on shrimp diseases. The project will commence this year.
- "Building capacity to combat invasive alien species and trans-boundary pathogens in aquaculture in the ASEAN region" a Joint ASEAN-U.S. Project on Invasive Alien Species in Aquaculture. This Project will primarily address 'health, pathogens and IAS' of aquatic animals and the implications and risks of trade and movement (introduction and transfers) on environmental health, biosecurity, and the broader issue of biodiversity and exotic species movement. been contracted to implement the project through a regional workshop that will be organized in 2004.

Latin America

• The FAO/RTCP/0710 "Assistance to Shrimp Health Management in Latin Americas" was successfully completed during a Final Workshop held in Ecuador from 27-30 May 2003. FHS Member Victoria Alday was Regional Coordinator of this program and participated by representatives from 13 countries in Latin America as well as Asian experts. Outcomes of this project are: (a) preparation of 'Technical Guidelines for the Management of Health and Maintenance of Biosecurity in White Shimp (Penaeus vannamei) Hatcheries in Latin America, (b) a continuing regional communications network (AquahealthLAC-L@mailserv.fao.org) and (c) a proposed establishment of the Fish Health Society in Latin America. Asia and Americas

- The APEC FWG 01/2002 "Capacity and awareness building on Import Risk Analysis (IRA) for Aquatic Animals" was successfully completed with two training/workshops on IRA held in Bangkok, Thailand (April 2002) and Mazatlan, Mexico (August 2002). Representatives from some 40 countries in Asia-Pacific and Latin America including private sector representatives participated in this project. The Technical Report of the Workshop is in the final stages of completion and an IRA Manual for Aquatic Animal Movement is expected before end of the year. Examples of follow-up national level activities resulting from this project are the following: (a) in Singapore is carrying out an ornamental fish disease surveillance for important ornamental fish diseases such as SVCV, VHS, IPN and IHN and KHV for kois; an Epidemiology Unit within AVA will also be established to carry out IRA; (b) in Thailand, a project to conduct an IRA on Pacific white shrimp, *Penaeus vannamei* will be undertaken by AAHRI involving an intensive survey of farms/hatcheries from June to September 2003. The project is funded by Thailand's National Bureau of Agricultural Commodity and Food Standards (ACFS).
- APEC FWG recently approved a project to conduct a 'A Feasibility Study on the Establishment of an Inter-Governmental Mechanism for the Development and Management of an Aquaculture Network in the Americas', a proposal drafted by the United States in response to tremendous support for a regional collaborative mechanism for sharing aquaculture technical expertise. This study will look specifically at the role of a new mechanism in promoting food safety and aquatic animal health. Project will be implemented in 2004 by FHS members MB Reantaso, MJ Phillips, RP Subasinghe and V Alday de Graindorge. Two APEC FWG funded health projects that this proposal extends or complements are: (a) Trans-boundary Aquatic Animal Pathogen Transfer and the Development of Harmonized Standards on Aquaculture Health Management (FWG 03/2000); and (b) Capacity and Awareness Building on Import Risk Analysis (IRA) for Aquatic Animals (FWG 01/2002)


Global

- Fish Disease Commission (FDC) of the OIE, is one of four specialist commissions of the OIE whose mandate is to compile information on diseases of fish, molluscs and crustaceans, and on methods used to control these diseases. The FDC produces the International Aquatic Animal Health Code and Diagnostic Manual for Aquatic Animal Diseases to fulfil its remit to propose the most appropriate diagnostic and disease prevention and control methods to ensure safe international trade or movement of aquatic animals. Three major areas of FDC activities are: (a) provision of advice and guidance; provision of information; and organization of scientific conferences on special themes. The new members of the FDC elected in May 2003 are:
 - President: Eva Maria Bernoth (Australia)
 - Vice-President: Barry Hill (United Kingdom)
 - Members: Ricardo Enriquez (Chile), Franck Berthe (France), and Eli Rwakishaya Katunguka (Uganda)
 - Permanent Observer: FAO represented by RP Subasinghe
- MolluscanHealthOne List (MolluscHealthOne-L@mailserv.fao.org) was launched in December 2002 following successful completion of Phase II of the Asia-Pacific Molluscan Health Management Program held in conjunction with DAA5. An Aquaculture Health list (Aquahealthlac-l@mailserv.fao.org) has also been recently set up by FAO as a continuing regional network communication following completion of the FAO TCP on Shrimp Health Management in the Americas. - An Expert Consultation on 'Surveillance and Zoning for Aquatic Animal Diseases' jointly organized by FAO, the Federal Department of Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO-Canada) and OIE was held in October 2002 at the FAO Headquarters in Rome, Italy to determine what surveillance options can best support scientifically valid zonation frameworks. The objective of the Expert Consultation was to provide recommendations for surveillance and zonation that will be useful for designing national programmes aimed at reducing the risks of disease losses through live transfers of aquatic animals. These recommendations are aimed solely at providing scientific advice to member countries building national or regional aquatic animal health infrastructures. The Report of the Expert Consultation is in preparation.
- AAPQIS Aquatic Animal Pathogen and Information System. One of major outcome of the FAO/NACA Regional Programme on Aquatic Animal Health Management is currently being reengineered with the following chapters: AAPQIS Asia- Pacific: NACA (Thailand); AAPQIS Latin America: Unidad Mazatlan de Ciad (Mexico); AAPQIS- Africa: World Fish Centre (Egypt); AAPQIS North America: Cooperative Oxford Laboratory (MD, USA)
- A potentially good opportunity for FHS members to get involved! Aquaculture Compendium, a new project being developed by CAB *International* and a number of partner organizations, is a versatile reference and problem solving resource which contains a taxonomic and systems-based framework, and displayed in an extremely user-friendly format to be available in CD-ROM format and also via the internet. The compendium, a comprehensive resource which hopes to offer quick and easy access to global information on aquaculture, will make use of existing databases and other aquaculture-related information. It includes a specific section that will help users to determine solutions for identifying, solving and preventing health problems in different production systems, including detailed coverage of pests and diseases. The compendium will be developed and funded through a consortium of donor




