We will be celebrating 30 years of continued research excellence since DAA1 in 1990 in Bali, Indonesia. Many of us met at DAA9 in Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam in 2014. We look forward to seeing you again in Bali in 2017!

The DAA9 was successfully held on 24-28 November 2014 at Rex Hotel, Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam. It was hosted and organized by the Department of Animal Health, Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development, Vietnam, and the local Organizing Committee headed by Dr. Nguyen Van Long. The meeting was attended by 356 participants from 33 countries around the world, with 99 oral presentations and 150 poster presentations on biosecurity, immunology, diagnostics, disease management, and emerging fish and shrimp diseases. The Japanese Society of Fish Pathology has agreed to publication of a special issue of selected conference proceedings as peer reviewed papers.

The current Exe-Com Chairperson, Dr Phan Thi Van is Director, Research Institute for Aquaculture No.1, Ministry of Agriculture and Rural development (MARD), Vietnam. The Vice-Chairperson Dr Agus Sunarto, is a Research Scientist - Fish Virologist at Ministry for Marine Affairs and Fisheries, Indonesia and CSIRO Biosecurity Flagship, Australian Animal Health Laboratory, Australia.

Training on fish disease investigation techniques was organised and facilitated by Dr Susan Gibson-Kueh from Murdoch University, and co-funded by The Crawford Fund. The training was based on real case studies and digitised fish histology slides and was held on two evenings during DAA9 in Ho Chi Minh City. Dr Supranee Chinabut, a senior adviser to Fisheries Department, Thailand, and Dr Andy Shinn, FishVet Group Asia, co-facilitated the sessions.

This workshop at DAA9 was attended by 19 participants from 9 countries including Saudi Arabia, Singapore, Israel, Thailand, Brunei, Vietnam, Philippines, India and Australia.

Applicants should have a Bachelor's degree and either 2 years' full time professional experience, or undertaken a graduate course of at least 1 year full time study, or hold a four year degree.
